


IDPH Weekly Influenza Surveillance Report Week ending July 18, 2009¹ Influenza Activity Level: LOCAL²

No activity: No laboratory confirmed cases of influenza and no reported increase in cases of influenza like illness (ILI).

Sporadic: Small numbers of laboratory confirmed influenza cases or a single laboratory confirmed influenza in a single region of the state.

Local: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI and recent laboratory confirmed influenza in a single region of the state.

Regional: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI and recent laboratory confirmed influenza in at least two but less than half the regions of the state.

Widespread: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory confirmed influenza in at least half the regions in the state.

 3 "Influenza like Illness" is defined as fever ≥ 100°F and cough and/or sore throat.

*Threshold=3.66%

Novel Influenza A (H1N1) Virus

As of 7/18/09, there have been 43,771 confirmed and probable human infections with swine origin influenza A (H1N1) virus in 52 states including the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands. Influenza & Pneumonia Mortality Surveillance

- Data from CDC 122 Cities Morbidity and Mortality Reporting System
- All age groups represented
- Five influenza-associated pediatric deaths were reported nation-wide. Of these, 4 were associated with novel influenza A (H1N1) viruses for CDC week 28.

Great Lakes Naval Academy Febrile Respiratory Illness Surveillance Update

Febrile respiratory illness in military recruits at NRTC Great Lakes was reported as substantially elevated.
